### **Objectives for skaters/coaches:**

- Give skaters exposure to judges
- Give the skaters the chance to know their competitors
- Motivate to train harder for next phase (final)
- Prioritize athlete's yearly plan (coach)
- Develop consistent training programs (coach)
- Increase competitiveness
- Improve their skating program (coach)
- Build team effort (in the case of show groups)
- Prepare skaters for World Championships

### **Objectives for organizers/Federations:**

- Promote the sport
- Inspire others to participate
- Develop professionalism
- Exposure of Roller Skating in all medias (TV, newspapers, radio)
- Plan each phase in a Continent (very important to bring to the east of the planet as the number of National and International competitions are minimal).
- Establish the entry order for short programs / style dance, junior and senior, Show and Precision at World Championships.

### **Objectives for Judges:**

- Experience in the discipline involved.
- Get to know the level in the discipline for the current year.

# Technical Rules

## COMPETITION RULES

- The World Cup will consist of three World Skate Open Competitions:
  - Two semifinals
  - One final

Each competition will be organized in a different country.

The period will be May-June.

## ENTRY RULES

For all the disciplines, each nation can send a maximum of three (3) participants for Cadet, Youth, Junior and Senior.

All the skaters and teams can take part in the two (2) semifinals. It's not mandatory to take part in both of them however, the highest Total Technical Score achieved will decide who is going to participate in the final.

For events judged using Rollart, the Total Technical Score is the sum of the Technical Score of the short/style and the Technical Score of the long/free dance.

Quartet Senior, Large Groups, Small Groups and Precision Senior will participate in just the final. There are no limits in participating groups.

An Open for the other categories (Tots to Espoir) will also be organized in the first two (2) events but not in the final. However, these events will be conducted at the beginning of the competition period. Nations can enter three (3) skaters in each competition/discipline/category.

**THERE WILL BE A WORLD RANKING (ON ROLLART SCORE) FOR THE CATEGORIES JUNIOR AND SENIOR. FOR THE PURPOSE OF RANKING, WORLD SKATE WILL TAKE THE BEST TOTAL TECHNICAL SCORE OF THE THREE COMPETITIONS.**



## **PLACEMENTS**

For skaters or teams that have participated in both semifinals, the best Total Technical Scores of the two competitions will be the one considered to qualify for the final.

**For Free Skating:** the first 10 for ladies and 10 for men (for Cadet, Youth, Junior and Senior) with the highest Total Technical Score will go to the final.

**For Couple Dance:** the first 8 (both for Junior and Senior) with the highest Total Technical Score will go to the final.

**For Pairs:** the first 8 (both for Junior and Senior) with the highest Total Technical Score will go to the final.

**For Solo Dance:** the first 10 for ladies and 10 for men (for Junior and Senior) with the highest Technical Scores will go to the final.

The final placements will be decided solely on the result of the final competition.

## **JUDGING SYSTEM**

For Free Skating, Pairs, Dance and Precision the judging system will be Rollart. For the show disciplines it will be the White System.

## **Organization Rules**

## **DATES AND PLACES**

First Semifinal: First week of May in Portugal.

Second Semifinal: Third week of May in Italy.

FINAL: first week of June in Germany.

## **PARTICIPATION FEE**

Each Federation will pay US\$100 participation fee to World Skate for each competition where they have representative skaters participating.

For each skater, there will be a participation fee of US\$50 for Free Skating, Pairs, Couple Dance and Solo Dance (\$60 for the final) and US\$50 for Show and Precision skaters.



**WORLD

If a skater participates in more than one discipline, the fee must be paid for each discipline.

Participation fees must be paid to Organization Committee.

### **SKATERS AWARDS -**

The prize amount will be \$1.500 just for **Gold Medalist of Senior, Show and Precision**. For teams and groups, the prize will go to the whole team/group and not to the individual skaters.
