## World Skate Annual Report for WADA - 2017

2017 has been a year of considerable achievements for World Skate. National Federations and Continental areas have a better understanding of the anti-doping process, correct filling in of doping control forms and the Technical Document Sports Specific Analysis requirements (TDSSA).

In 2017 World Skate were responsible for results management of 288 tests across the 9 disciplines of Rollersports. Of the 288 samples 15 were additional samples as the result of samples with a SG of less than 1.005 and 6 were blood and urine samples collected at the same session. The total number of tests was therefore 267. There were also 5 blood sample for passport that were delayed in customs in transit to the laboratory which not suitable for analysis. Of the 288 samples 45 were out of competition.

It has been a struggle and time consuming to cleanse the data, including for the out of competition tests managed by DFSU. Each download seems to have different issues so the TDSSA compliance was very difficult to monitor, but now the data seems to be matched and all the problems resolved. I am hoping this will be easier in 2018 as now the laboratories and sampling agencies will be much more aware of the importance of accurate data input.

Alpine & Downhill, Roller freestyle, inline freestyle, and skateboarding had no TDSSA requirement in 2017.

#### **APMU**

World Skate use the APMU at the Lausanne lab.

#### **Registered Testing Pool (RTP)**

The management of the WSK out of competition testing programme is contracted to DFSU(GAISF).

World Skate had twelve (12) athletes on the RTP in 2017 all from the highest risk discipline of inline speed skating. All had at least three (3) tests in the twelve months (12) including athlete haematological passport. The loss of the Bogota lab adversely affected the passport programme with 5 samples that couldn't be analysed due to being delayed in customs for 5 days on the way to the Rio lab. World Skate collected 13 other samples for biological passport in 2017.

48 tests were completed out of competition. 6 included urine and blood tests making 42 out of competition sample collection episodes. 6 blood tests were completed for GH as well as for haematological ABP

#### **Whereabouts Failures**

There were 4 whereabouts failures in 2017 with no athletes recording 3 whereabouts failures in a twelve month period.

#### **AAFs and Results Management**

World Skate Anti-doping Review Panel managed 6 AAF in 2017

One was for a National athlete managed by World Skate on behalf of the Spanish NADO during their period of suspension. This was a very unsatisfactory arrangement due to uncertainty about who was responsible for what, however a satisfactory resolution was achieved in the end.

Four were considered on the balance of probability to be due to clenbuterol food contamination in China. Levels were less than -05ng/ml, athletes provided food diaries and all reports were forwarded to WADA. My thanks to CHINADA and other NADOs for assistance with this process.

The fifth case was due to supplement use and has been taken forward as an ADRV and the athlete has been sanctioned.

#### **ATPF**

All ATPF have been and are being managed in accordance with the recommendation of the APMU.

#### **Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE)**

World Skate TUE have approved two TUEs an endorsed several others from various NADOs



## Education


World Skate enabled the attendance of the Anti-doping manager to the 2017 WADA symposium for IF and NADOs in 2017. This is a very valuable educational resource. The TUEC Chair attended the TUE symposium in Helsinki.

Approximately 140 athletes and support personnel completed the ALPHA programme and all Australian athletes and support personnel completed ASADA level 1 and 2 e-learning in 2017.. Face to face education was provided for skateboarders and inline freestyle athletes at the World Roller Games in Nanjing. World Skate partnered with CHINADA to provide education to all athletes and support personnel in attendance. CHINADA reports that 600 people attended.

2017 was the implementation year for compulsory education as a pre requisite to entry into World Skate events and a certificate of education will be a compulsory requisite to register for WSK events in 2018.

WSK is currently promoting the use of ADeL as an educational tool

We continue to email anti-doping education to anti-doping contacts for National federations and to post material to the WSK webpage.
