Dear Sirs,

Following the recent increased provisions around the world to contain the Coronavirus (COVID-19), please find a new update below regarding the World Skate SLS World Tour: Las Vegas 2020.

Current COVID-19 confirmed cases: 1039

<u>CDC Risk Assessment</u> Level for COVID-19: Risk of limited community transmission (1 of 4)

Travel restrictions: From midnight (EDT) on 13 March, all entry for non-US nationals who have been in the Schengen Area in Europe at any point in the past 14 days before arrival in the US will be suspended for 30 days. The countries affected by the Schengen Area restrictions are Austria, Belgium, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Iceland, Italy, Latvia, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, the Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, and Switzerland.

Foreign nationals (other than the immediate family of US citizens, permanent residents, and flight crew) who have been in China within 14 days of their arrival will be denied entry into the United States. US citizens who have been in Hubei province within 14 days of their return will be subject to up to 14 days of mandatory quarantine.

On 2 March, the US extended its entry ban to foreign travelers who have traveled to Iran within 14 days of their arrival in the US.
