



EXECUTIVE BOARD RESOLUTION

No. 3/2026

Pursuant to the “One Country-One Federation” principle introduced during the 2019 Congress in Barcelona, and subsequently enshrined in Article 3 of the World Skate Statutes, which provides that “*World Skate recognizes only one National Federation per Country*” and that, “*in Countries where more than one Member Federation has been recognized by World Skate, the different entities shall establish a sole governing body*”, the resulting entity being considered “*as the sole National Governing Body for all World Skate Sports in the relevant Country*”, World Skate has adopted a series of measures aimed at consolidating pre-existing multi-federation structures into a sole National Governing Body for each Country.

By [Resolution No. 1/2024 of 10 January 2024](#), concerning Belarus and Russia, the Executive Board temporarily placed on hold the process leading to the establishment of a sole National Governing Body in those Countries in light of the international sporting restrictions then applicable, and reserved its final decision on their respective governance structures, subject in all cases to compliance with the World Skate Charters.

Following the decision adopted by the International Olympic Committee (IOC) Executive Board on 7 May 2026 to lift the recommended conditions of participation for International Federations and international sports event organisers of 28 February 2022 and 28 March 2023 concerning the participation of Belarusian athletes and support personnel, World Skate adopted [Resolutions No. 1/2026](#) in line with [updated IOC directives](#) that fully lifted restrictions on Belarusian athletes and support personnel.

For the purposes of Resolution No. 1/2024, the Executive Board determines that these developments have removed the factual and regulatory circumstances underlying the temporary hold and allow World Skate to take the final governance decision contemplated therein.



Article 3.4 of the World Skate Statutes expressly provides that, where the entities previously recognised in the same Country fail to establish a sole governing body by agreement, the Executive Board may, after hearing the opinion of the competent National Sports Authority, choose the National Governing Body responsible for all World Skate Sports in that Country.

The Executive Board has reviewed the governance documents, national accreditation records and other supporting documentation submitted in relation to **Belarusian Federation of Roller Sports and Skateboard** and has determined that its governance structure and institutional remit comply with the applicable requirements of the World Skate Statutes, By-Laws and other applicable World Skate Rules and Regulations.

Accordingly, in light of the One Country-One Federation principle, the authority conferred upon the Executive Board by Congress pursuant to Article 3 of the Statutes, and the verified documentation confirming Belarusian Federation of Roller Sports and Skateboard's recognition by the competent national sports authorities, the Executive Board resolves as follows:

1. Pursuant to Article 3.4 of the World Skate Statutes and Paragraphs 2.1 and 2.2 of the World Skate By-Laws, the new governance structure of the Belarusian Federation of Roller Sports and Skateboard is hereby ratified, and the **Belarusian Federation of Roller Sports and Skateboard** is designated and recognised as the sole National Governing Body and sole World Skate Member Federation in Belarus for all Sports and disciplines governed by World Skate.
2. PA Belarusian Skateboarding Federation was the other Member Federation recognised by World Skate in Belarus. However, it has remained inactive and has ceased any institutional engagement with World Skate, including in relation to the governance-unification process. Furthermore, the competent National Sports Authorities have confirmed that the Belarusian Federation of Roller Sports and Skateboard is the only entity officially recognised at national level. Consequently, PA Belarusian Skateboarding Federation shall cease to be recognised as a World Skate Member Federation or National Governing Body with effect from the adoption of



this Resolution. This determination concerns exclusively its status within World Skate and does not affect its legal existence, if any, under Belarusian law.
