ANTI-DOPING

The doping controls, the sample collection processes and the laboratory analysis will be conducted in accordance with the World Anti-doping Code and the OCA (Olympic Council of Asia) Antidoping Rules..

During the sign-up procedure to the Sports Registration System (World Skate Infinity, please see above), all athletes and staff members must upload a valid Anti-Doping Training Course Certificate. Specifically, all athletes heading to the Games will need to complete the ADEL, which is provided by WADA, for International Level Athlete (ILA) e-learning module and all coaches will need to complete the ADEL for Coaches of High Performance (CHP) e-learning module successfully.

All competing athletes are classified as International-Level Athletes and must hold a Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE) in advance for medical use of prohibited substances. Pre-existing TUEs will follow the recognition process and there is no need to re-submit a TUE. Athletes without a valid TUE must submit an application directly to the ITA (the International Testing Agency) according to the following [process](#).

Should you need a new Anti-Doping Training Course Certificate, please visit the [WADA ADEL platform](#) and complete the relevant Course, according to your role.

We remind you that the [WADA ADEL platform](#) is not run by World Skate; therefore, should you have any issue in this regard, you will need to contact WADA's support directly.

FURTHER INFORMATION

The Local Organizing Committee (LOC) has put at disposal a Technical Leader (TL) Guide for all National Olympic Committees (NOCs). This Guide contains sports information (including detailed schedule) and information about the services to be provided at the Games, as well as the contact details of the relevant sports organisations.

The National Federations can obtain the Asian Games 2026 TL Guide from the Aichi Nagoya Asian Games Organizing Committee (AINAGOC) extranet through their National Olympic Committee.
