1. INTRODUCTION

The World Skate Inline Freestyle World Ranking is a classification of skaters established for each of the disciplines of Inline Freestyle:

Speed Slalom, Classic Freestyle Slalom, Battle Freestyle Slalom, Free Jump, Freestyle Slides, Pair Freestyle Slalom.

Each homologated event will award World ranking points to their participants. The Rankings are updated every month, and points are dropped 12 months after being awarded or when the same event is held the next year.

Inline Freestyle World Rankings will be updated at www.worldskate.org in the beginning of each month.

The World Rankings aim to be objective, and merit based. They reflect, each month, who the best and most consistent skaters have been over the past twelve months.

They also highlight the most dedicated skaters in each discipline, as well as the National Federations that provide the strongest support for Inline Freestyle at both the national and international levels.

2. EVENTS

2.1. TYPES OF EVENTS

Different tier of events will award points:

- Starter events
- 1-star events / Basic events
- 2 stars events / Prime events
- 3 stars events / Main events

- National Championships
- Continental Championships
- World Championships

All international events shall be organized in accordance with the latest version of the World Skate Rulebook.

2.2. EVENTS REGISTRATION

2.2.1 The events must receive approval from the National Federation of the country where they are held.

2.2.2. The events shall be registered by the Inline Freestyle representative of the National Federation, using the official registration form described in the Annex (2).

2.2.3. Once the approval process is completed and the fee has been paid to World Skate, the events shall appear on the World Ranking Events Calendar on World Skate official website:

2.3. EVENTS PARTICIPANTS

2.3.1. All participants must hold a valid registration with their national federation or with the national federation that has sanctioned the event, or any national federation recognized by World Skate.

2.3.2. In the case that no national federation is registered in the country, or affiliated to World Skate, participants can participate with a Wild Card granted by World Skate.

Wild Card requests must be sent to platform@worldskate.org.

2.3.3. All participants shall be registered in the World Ranking database with a personal Inline Freestyle World Skate Identification Number prior to the event for Main international events.

The Local Organizing Committee representative, Staff, Calculator Judge, or the Inline Freestyle representative of the National Federation must submit the list of participants who do not yet have an Identification Number to inlinefreestyle@worldskate.org, using the official spreadsheet provided in the Annex (3). Incomplete or missing information about skaters may result in their points not being considered for the World Ranking.

2.4. EVENTS RESULTS

2.4.1. All results must be submitted in the correct format, using the official spreadsheet provided in the Annex (3). The official results publication shall also be submitted in PDF format including best times in Speed Slalom (Time trials and K.O best times), and best height in Free Jump.

2.4.2. The results must be submitted during the week following an event, to avoid any delay in the World Ranking publication. Results not received on time may not be considered in the monthly World Ranking publication.

2.4.3. The results must contain complete information about all participants, including Inline Freestyle World Skate ID number.

2.5. STARTER EVENTS

Starter events are the smallest events awarding points for the World ranking. They are mostly local events but can also be organized on a regional scale or national scale.

2.5.1. There is no fee to be paid to World Skate for this scale event.

2.5.2. There is no limitation in the number of Starter events in a City, Country, Continent per year.

This category of event can be organized in any city.

2.5.3. Starter events can be announced at the latest 4 weeks before the events.

2.5.4. A minimum of 1 discipline among the Inline Freestyle disciplines shall be organized.

2.5.5. There are no compulsory age categories to be organized, however the age categories should follow the official national or international rules.

2.5.6. The event may be only open to national skaters.

2.5.7. Top 3 skaters will be awarded with medals or Trophies.

2.5.8. No World Records shall be approved during Starter events.

2.5.9. A minimum of 4 judges will be in charge, among them at least one national certified judge to lead the event.

2.5.10. Judges' allowances for Starter events are set according to the local Federation rules.

2.5.11. The registration process will follow the local federation's registration rules.

2.5.12. Exceptionally, this type of event can also be flexible in the rules and technical requirements (venue size, number of cone lines, number of cones, timing), in such case, the rules must be approved by the local federation, or by

the Continental World Skate inline Freestyle Technical commission and clearly announced by the event's organization.

2.5.13. Main technical and venue requirements are available upon request to the national federation and/or in the corresponding Rulebook or Handbook.

2.6. BASIC EVENTS (1 STAR)

Basic events are mostly regional scale or national scale events.

2.6.1. There is no fee to be paid to World Skate for this scale event.

2.6.2. There is no limitation in the number of Basic events in a City, Country, Continent per year.

2.6.3. This category of event can be organized in any city, but the venue must be accessible easily by local public transportation.

2.6.4. Basic events shall be announced at the latest 6 weeks before the events. Registration should start at the latest 4 weeks in advance.

2.6.5. A minimum of 1 discipline among the Inline Freestyle disciplines shall be organized.

2.6.6. There are no compulsory age categories to be organized, however the age categories should follow the official national or international rules.

2.6.7. The event may be only open to national skaters.

2.6.8. Top 3 skaters will be awarded with medals or Trophies.

2.6.9. No World Records shall be approved during Basic events.

2.6.10. The judging panel shall consist of a minimum of 2 to 7 judges, depending on the number and type of disciplines organized. Among them, at least two nationally certified judges shall be included in the panel to lead the event.

2.6.11. Judge's allowance for Basic events is set according to the local Federation rules.

2.6.12. The registration process will follow the local federation's registration rules.

2.6.13. Main technical and venue requirements are available upon request to the local national federation and/or in the corresponding Rulebook or Handbook.

2.7. PRIME EVENTS (2 STARS)

Prime events are international / continental scale events.

2.7.1. The local organizing committee shall pay a fee to World Skate for the event to be included in the calendar. The fee is available upon request to sportsdepartment@worldskate.org.

2.7.2. Prime events are events gathering a minimum of 60 skaters in total.

2.7.3. Each category within each discipline shall comprise a minimum of 8 athletes representing at least three different countries. Failing to meet this requirement, the category shall be merged with another category, according to the decision of the Chief Referee or Race director.

2.7.4. There is a limitation in the number of Prime events in a Country, Continent per year. The balance of maximum events in each continental area is determined according to the number of participants in the continental areas, the actual state of development of each inline freestyle discipline in the continental areas (national championships, continental championships, number of events) and the average level of participants in the continental events. This number is re-evaluated each year by the World Skate Inline Freestyle Technical Commission according to the evolution of the development of each inline freestyle discipline in each Continent.

The maximum of events (including all disciplines) per continent is described in the table below:

2.7.5. A maximum of two Prime events may be organized in the same country. In exceptional cases, if the quota is not reached, a third event in the same country may be approved by the Continental World Skate Inline Freestyle Technical Commission.

2.7.6. A minimum of three disciplines — among Speed Slalom, Classic Freestyle Slalom, Battle Freestyle Slalom, Free Jump, and Freestyle Slide — shall be organized.

2.7.7. If all disciplines do not reach the maximum quota, additional Prime events may be granted Prime status until the maximum quota is fulfilled for all disciplines.

2.7.8. Prime events must be announced no later than 12 weeks before the event, and registration must open at least 8 weeks prior to the event. The local organizing committee and/or the National Federation is responsible for managing the registration process.

2.7.9. The event shall be scheduled over a minimum of two days.

2.7.10. Senior Men and Women, and Junior U19 Men and U19 Women categories shall be organized in Speed Slalom, Classic Freestyle Slalom, Battle Freestyle Slalom, Free Jump, Freestyle Slides.

2.7.11. Senior and U19 categories might be merged into a single category, in Classic Freestyle Slalom, Battle Freestyle Slalom, Freestyle Slides, Free Jump and Speed Slalom.

2.7.12. U15 participants may register, and U15 categories may be organized with a 1-star (Basic) status and awarded points accordingly. If a U15 category is organized at a Prime Event, U15 skaters must compete in that category, unless an exception list of skaters is published by World Skate.

2.7.13. No U10 categories shall be organized during Prime events, and U10 athletes are not permitted to register.

2.7.14. The Judging Panel shall consist of a minimum of 4 to 7 judges, depending on the number and type of disciplines organized. All judges must hold at least a national certification, and a minimum of two must be internationally certified judges. An additional calculator judge shall also be part of the panel.

2.7.15. Judge's allowance fee for prime events is available upon request to sportsdepartment@worldskate.org. Chief referee and Calculator judge have an additional allowance corresponding to the extra administrative work prior and after the event.

2.7.16. No World Records shall be approved during Prime events.

2.7.17. The registration shall be closed 10 days in advance.

2.7.18. Registration is open to all; however, the current top 20 athletes in each discipline will have priority access to the event over other participants. The local organizing committee, in accordance with the continental Inline Freestyle Technical Commission, may restrict the registration to the best ranked skaters of the World Ranking only (for example top 200).

The number of U15 category athletes allowed to participate shall be limited, the priority being given to Seniors and U19 athletes. Registered athletes must already have Inline Freestyle World Skate Identification Number to be allowed to

register to Prime events.

A limited number of Wild card skaters without Identification number may be accepted by the event's organization, according to each specific situation.

2.7.19. Organizers of Prime events must be experienced organizers or National Federations.

2.7.20. Technical and venue requirements are available in the corresponding Rulebook or Handbook.

2.8. WORLD CUP MAIN EVENTS (3 STARS)

World Cup Main events are international / inter-continental scale events.

2.8.1. The organization shall pay a fee to World Skate for the event to be included in the calendar.

The fee is available upon request to sportsdepartment@worldskate.org.

Main events' confirmation deadline for 2026 is on the 30th of January 2026. Main events' confirmation deadline for 2027 and following years is on 31st of October. (The deadline might be postponed according to World Skate Sport Department's decision)

2.8.2. Main events are events gathering a minimum of 100 skaters in total.

2.8.3. Each category within each discipline shall comprise a minimum of 12 athletes representing at least five different countries. Failing to meet this requirement, the category shall be merged with another category, according to the decision of the Chief Referee or Race director.

2.8.4. There is a limitation in the number of Main events in a Country, Continent per year. The balance of maximum events in each continental area is determined according to the number of participants in the continental areas, the actual state of development of each inline freestyle disciplines in the continental areas (national championships, continental championships, number of events, ...), and the average level of participants in the continental areas. This number is re-evaluated each year by the World Skate Inline Freestyle Technical commission according to the evolution of the development of each inline freestyle discipline in each area.

The maximum of events per continent is described in the table below:

2.8.5. A maximum of 1 Main event can be organized in a same country. In exceptional cases, if the event quota is not reached, a 2nd event in a same country may be approved by the World Skate Inline Freestyle Technical Commission.

2.8.6. The event registration Deadline for 2026 31st of Dec
Deadline for 2027 □ End of October (deadline might be postponed)

2.8.7. A minimum of three disciplines — among Speed Slalom, Classic Freestyle Slalom, Battle Freestyle Slalom, Free Jump, and Freestyle Slide — shall be organized.

2.8.8. If all disciplines do not reach the maximum quota, additional events may be granted Main status until the maximum quota is fulfilled for all disciplines.

2.8.9. The event shall be scheduled over a minimum of three days.

2.8.10. Senior Men and Women, Junior U19 Men and U19 Women categories shall be organized in Speed Slalom, Classic Freestyle Slalom, Battle Freestyle Slalom, Free Jump, Freestyle Slides.

2.8.11. Senior and U19 categories may be merged into a single category in Classic Freestyle Slalom, Battle Freestyle Slalom, Freestyle Slides, and Speed Slalom.

2.8.12. U15 participants might not be allowed (unless an exception list of skaters is published by World Skate) or U15 categories may be organized with a 1-star (Basic) status and awarded points accordingly. If a U15 category is organized at a Main Event, U15 skaters must compete in that category, unless an exception list of skaters is published by World Skate.

2.8.13. No U10 categories shall be organized during Main events, and U10 athletes are not permitted to register.

2.8.14. The homologation of World, Continental, and National Records may take place during Main events, subject to strict compliance with the World Skate validation protocol. (Applicable to best time in Speed Slalom and best height in Free Jump.)

2.8.15. The judging panel shall consist of a minimum of 9 judges appointed by the Continental Technical Commission. All judges shall be internationally certified. An additional calculator judge shall also be part of the panel.

2.8.16. Judge's allowance fee for main events is available upon request to sportsdepartment@worldskate.org. Chief referee and Calculator judge have an additional allowance corresponding to the extra administrative work prior and after the event.

2.8.17. The registration will be closed 1 week in advance before the start of the event.

2.8.18. Registration is open to all; however, the current top 20 athletes in each discipline will have priority access to the event over other participants. The local organizing committee, in accordance with the World Skate Inline Freestyle Technical Commission, may restrict the registration to the best ranked skaters of the World Ranking only (for example top 100).

The number of U15 category athletes allowed to participate shall be limited, the priority being given to Seniors and U19 athletes. Registered athletes must already have Inline Freestyle World Skate Identification Number to be allowed to register to Main events.

2.8.19. Organizers of Main events must be experienced organizers or National Federations, or professional event company followed up by inline Freestyle Technical Commission members.

2.8.20. Technical and venue requirements are available in the corresponding Rulebook or Handbook.

2.9. OTHER EVENTS

Other events will award points for the Inline Freestyle World Rankings:

- Inline Freestyle World Championships shall award points as a Major event.
- The World Cup final shall award points as Main event (3 stars).
- Continental Championships shall award points as Prime events (2 stars).
- National Championships shall award points as Basic events (1 star).

The homologation of World, Continental, and National Records may take place during World or Continental events, subject to strict compliance with the validation protocol. (Applicable to best time in Speed Slalom and best height in Free Jump.)

2.10. EVENT SANCTIONING PROCESS

2.10.1. Each National Federation is responsible for proposing the Main and Prime events organized in its country to the World Skate Inline Freestyle Continental Technical Commission.

2.10.2. The Continental Technical Commission shall review the applications and determine which events will be sanctioned as Main and Prime events, as well as assign other event statuses (Basic and Starter).

2.10.3. The Continental Technical Commissions shall then submit the selected Main and Prime events to the World Skate Technical Commission for final approval.

2.10.4. Each National Federation shall also inform the World Skate Continental Inline Freestyle Technical Commission of the National Championship, Starter, and Basic events to be held in its country.

3. RANKING RULES

3.1. WORLD RANKING CATEGORIES

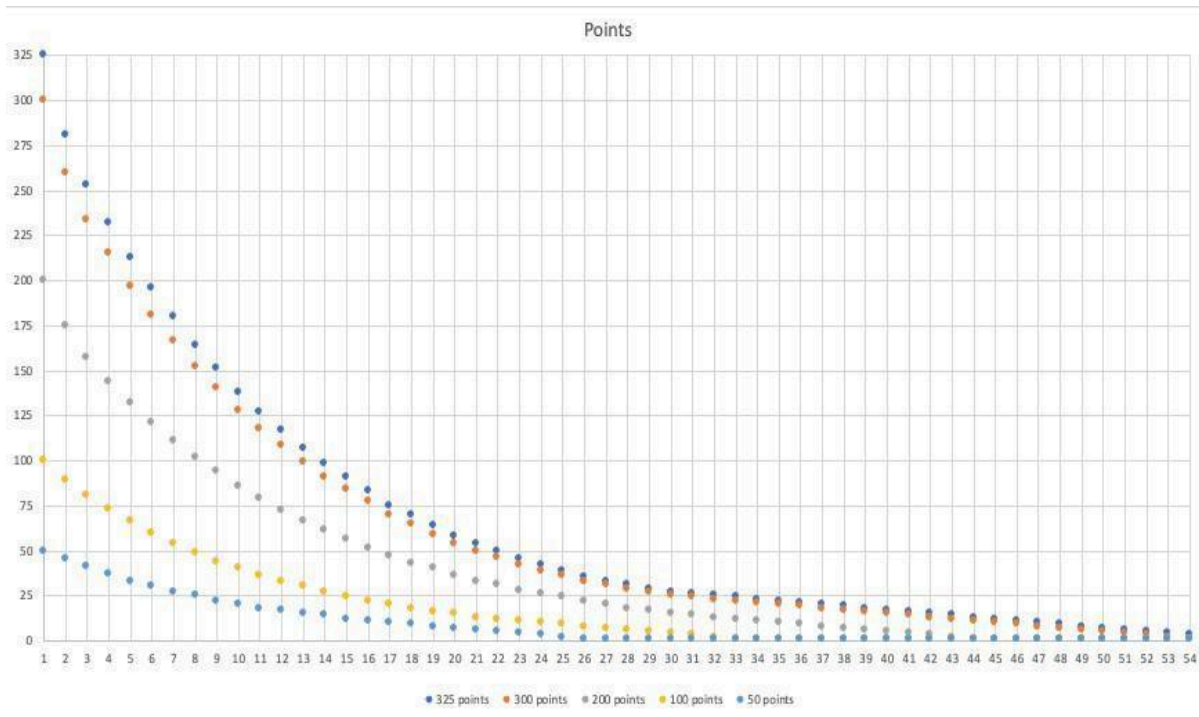
3.1.1. The categories for which a World Ranking will be published each month are Senior (Pro – including U19 skaters) and Junior (U19 – Including U15 skaters). There shall be no separate World Ranking for the U15 category.

3.1.2. For the Pair Freestyle Slalom ranking, the Men, Women, U19, and U15 categories are combined into a single ranking.

3.1.3. A “Pro” Ranking combining Senior and Junior (U19) skaters may also be published, from time to time, the month following a World Cup Main event, or Prime event, but it shall not include skaters from the U15 category (unless an exception list of skaters is published by World Skate).

3.2. POINTS TABLE

Points will be awarded to all skaters entering any event included in the World Ranking calendar as the table in Annex 2.



3.3. POINTS AWARDING

3.3.1. Skaters entering World Skate World Ranking events shall be awarded points, with a minimum of one point granted to each participating skater.

3.3.2. Skaters who register but fail to appear or compete in each discipline shall receive no points for that discipline, even if recorded as DNS (Did Not Start) in the official results.

3.3.3. Disqualified skaters — for example, athletes who receive a disqualification (DQ) in both qualification runs in Speed Slalom, or athletes who fail to clear the first bar height in Free Jump — shall be awarded one point.

3.3.4. In cases where multiple subcategories are organized, each subcategory shall be awarded points corresponding to the lower event category. For example, in a Basic status event, the Junior U19 category shall be awarded Basic status points, while the other junior subcategories (U17, U15, U13, etc.) shall receive Starter event points.

The same rule applies to senior subcategories (Over 30, Over 40, etc.).

3.3.5. In cases where a subcategory gathers fewer than five skaters, including merged gender categories, those skaters shall be ranked immediately after the previous age category and shall receive points accordingly.

For example, if the U15 category includes five skaters and the U13 category includes four skaters, the four U13 skaters shall be ranked from 6th to 9th place for World Ranking purposes and shall receive points accordingly.

3.3.6. Competitions must include a minimum of two skaters to be considered valid. Results from categories with only one competitor shall not be recognized, and no points shall be awarded in such cases.

3.3.7. When age or gender categories are merged within a competition, ranking points shall be awarded according to the athletes' final position in the merged category. For instance, if a junior woman finishes 1st and a senior man 2nd, the senior man shall receive the points for 2nd place and shall not be reclassified within his respective age or gender category.

3.3.8. When an age or gender category includes fewer than three competitors, it is strongly recommended to merge it with another suitable category, if possible. The merger may involve combining Junior and Senior categories, or Men and Women within the same age group, subject to the Chief Referee's or Race Director's decision.

3.4. SUMMING OF POINTS

3.4.1. Best 4

3.4.1.1. The first criterion used to rank skaters is the **"Best 4"** rule: among all competitions a skater participates in within a 12-month period for a given discipline, only the four highest scores shall be retained.

For example, if a skater competes in five Speed Slalom events and earns 300 pts, 215 pts, 89 pts, 157 pts, and 38 pts respectively, their "Best 4" total will be 761 pts. Starting from 2026, the ranking in all disciplines shall be based on the "Best 4" results, with a maximum of 1,225 points per discipline.

3.4.1.1. Points awarded to a skater shall expire 12 months after being granted, or when the same event is held again the following year. In such cases, the new points obtained will replace the previous ones from that event.

3.4.1.2. For Main events, points may be retained for more than 12 months if the next edition of the same event takes place more than 12 months later within the following year.

3.4.1.3. For Continental and World Championships, if held every two years, the points from these events shall remain valid for up to 24 months, or until the next edition of the respective Championship is organized.

3.4.2. Total Points

The second criterion used to rank skaters who have the same number of points in their "Best 4" shall be the total number of points they have earned during the previous 12-month period.

For example, if two skaters both have 1,200 points in their “Best 4,” but Skater 1 has a higher total number of points than Skater 2, then Skater 2 shall be ranked after Skater 1.

If Skater 3 has a higher total number of points than Skater 1 and Skater 2, but a lower “Best 4,” Skater 3 shall be ranked after Skater 1 and Skater 2.

3.4.3. Ties

In cases where two skaters have the same number of points in both their “Best 4” and their total points, they shall share the same ranking.

3.5 NEW RULES APPLICATION

3.5.1. New rules are applied starting from the beginning of a new year and will start to appear in the January ranking.

3.5.2. New rules affecting the point system will be applied month by month, slowly replacing the points awarded the previous year in the same events.

3.5.3. New rules affecting Best 3 or Best 4 events will be applied from January ranking.

4. RANKING RECORDS

4.1. MONTHLY RECORDS

At the beginning of each month, the World N°1 is known.

2 types of records can be calculated and published.

- The record of total months at the place of World N°1
- The record of total consecutive months at the place of World N°1

4.2. END OF YEAR RANKING

The end of year ranking is published in January of the next year. The top 3 skaters of each category and disciplines shall be awarded a certificate stamped by the Inline Freestyle Technical Commission.
