# 1. Introduction

The Skate Cross World Ranking is an official classification system that ranks skaters based on their performance in sanctioned events.

The ranking is updated monthly, with points expiring 12 months after being awarded or when the same event is held the following year.

This system aims to objectively reflect the most consistent and highest-performing skaters over the last year.

Skate Cross Working Group Manager will update the ranking on www.worldskate.org at the beginning of each month.

# 2. Ranking Rules

#### 2.1. Points table

Points are awarded based on event type and skater placement, following the official points distribution table (Annex 1).

#### 2.2. Points awarding

Every skater who enters and competes in a World Skate sanctioned event earns points, with a minimum of 1 point for participation. Skaters who register but do not compete (DNS - Did Not Start) receive no points. In the case of event cancellation, no points are awarded.

Points awarded to a skater will expire 12 months after being awarded or when the same event is held the next year; in such case the new points awarded will replace the previous points awarded for the same event.

## 2.2.1. Best 4

A skater's four highest-scoring events over the last 12 months determine their ranking. This rule ensures that the most active and successful skaters are fairly ranked.

For example, a skater who participates in four events and scores 400 points in a Prime Event, 480 points in a Main Event, 240 points in another Prime Event, and 200 points in a second Main Event will have a total "Best 4" score of 1320 points

## 2.2.2. Total Points

If two (2) or more skaters have identical "Best 4" totals, their total points over all events within the last 12 months serve as a tiebreaker.

For example, if two (2) skaters score 1200 points in their "Best 4", and skater 1 has scored a higher total than skater 2, skater 2 will be ranked after skater 1.

If skater 3 has a higher total points than skater 1 and skater 2, but a lower "Best 4", skater 3 will be ranked after skater 1 and skater 2.

## 2.2.3. Ties and Resolution

If two (2) skaters have the same "Best 4" points and total points over the last 12 months, they share the same rank. In such cases, the following ranking position is skipped to maintain ranking consistency. For example, if two (2) skaters tie for 5th place, the next skater will be ranked 7th.

## 2.3. Application of New Rules

Any ranking rule changes take effect at the start of a new calendar year. Adjustments affecting point calculations will be applied progressively, ensuring fairness to already ranked athletes.

# 3. Categories

## 3.1. Skate Cross

Here are the following categories for the World Skate Skate Cross World Ranking:

- Junior U16 Women
- Junior U16 Men
- Junior U19 Women
- Junior U19 Men
- Senior Women
- Senior Men

Each category has a separate ranking, ensuring fair competition among age groups.
