Introducing the World Skateboarding Ranking

With the completion of the Olympic Qualification Season on June 24, 2024, World Skate is pleased to release the fundamental rules that will regulate the World Skateboarding Ranking (WSR) from now until the beginning of the Los Angeles 2028 Olympic Qualification Season.

Principles Governing the World Skateboarding Ranking

Naming

The leading rankings maintained by WSK are known as the World Skateboarding Ranking (WSR). During the Olympic Qualification Season, the prefix "Olympic" is added, resulting in the Olympic World Skateboarding Ranking (OWSR). The ranking is maintained continuously between the Olympic Qualification Period (OQP) and the Inter-Qualification Period (IQP), which is the interval between two OQPs.

Please note that in addition to the World Skateboarding Ranking, World Skate may hold other subsidiary or subordinated rankings based on geographical or event tiering system criteria.

Rolling Ranking

The World Skateboarding Ranking operates on a rolling basis, meaning events contribute to the ranking within a set validity period, managed as follows:

Event Age

Once an event is held, the points derived from it are added to the WSR, and an Age attribute is assigned and set to zero. The age of the event will increase as follows:

- The calendar month of the event's finals date is set as age 0.
- Starting from the first day of the following month, and until the end of that month, the age increments to 1.
- Subsequently, the age increments by one unit at the beginning of each following month.



Event Status

The inclusion of points from an event in the WSR is based on the event's status:

Scheduled: An event is scheduled when it is confirmed and added to the WSR calendar but hasn't yet started.

Ongoing: This status is set while the event is running, starting from the first day of practice and concluding once a final ranking is produced.

Active: An event is active when its AGE is between 0 and 18.

Expired: An event expires when its AGE is 19 or above.

WSR Calculation

Only active events contribute to the WSR calculation. The ranking is recalculated any time at least one event changes status from ONGOING to ACTIVE or from ACTIVE to EXPIRED. The best 4 point-results for Street and the best 3 point-results for Park are added to establish each athlete's total WSR points.

Points Allocation

Points are allocated in the WSR to athletes based on their rank in the final event results, according to the World Skate competition rules and the points allocation table currently in force already used for Phase 1 of the Paris 2024 OQP (<u>Paris 2024 Skateboarding Qualification Point System V1</u>).

WSR Events

Following the completion of the OQP for Paris 2024, the current provisions have been adopted to transition from the OWSR to the WSR as of the 8th of July 2024:

- All skaters and their relevant points, accrued during Phase 1 of the Paris OQP, are reinstated in the WSR.
- The Olympic Qualifier Series events held in Shanghai and Budapest are added to the WSR and attributed the same point scale allocation as Pro Tour events.



Future WSR Iterations

While the above notions remain the base approach to WSR management, further adjustments may be implemented upon launching the 2025 events calendar later this year.
